


Figure 2: The Four Stages Common to those who are dying from cancer.

People often talk about wanting to have a 'good death'. What dying well means is unique for each person, shaped by individual attitudes, cultural background. Although nurses suffered emotional distress when caring for dying cancer patients, these experiences helped them to reflect on the meaning of death and life. Talking about death and dying is always difficult. Ask social workers, nurses, child life psychologists, or other specialists for advice about how to talk about death.
