THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN FROGS & TOADS

There isn't one. Toads are frogs! "Toad" often references a frog that has particularly dry and warty skin.

HERE, THERE, EVERYWHERE!

There are over 4,000 known species of frog living on every continent except Antarctica. They thrive in a wide range of environments from tropical forest to frozen tundra to desert.

SMALL, MEDIUM, LARGE

The West African goliath frog can grow to 13 inches and weigh as much as 7 pounds.

The Cuban tree toad typically grows to only half an inch.

TOTALLY OLD SCHOOL

Scientists believe the earliest known frogs date back about 250 million years—to a time when dinosaurs were still roaming the earth.

A group of frogs are referred to as a **chorus**.
A group of toads are referred to as a **congregation**.

GROW, TADPOLE, GROW!

Most frogs hatch as fish-like larvae known as tadpoles. At this early stage, most species live exclusively in water (though there are some terrestrial tadpoles). Tadpoles eventually transform into frogs in a process known as metamorphosis. Depending on the species, this process can take days or even years. Here's a breakdown of the typical life cycle.
